And Now a Word from Our Partners

USDA/FSA Update

- Agricultural producers can now change election and enroll in the Agriculture Risk Coverage (ARC) and Price Loss Coverage programs for the 2023 crop year. Signup began Monday, and producers have until March 15, 2023, to enroll in these two programs.
- The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) launched a new online tool to help farmers and ranchers better navigate the farm loan application process. This uniform application process will help to ensure all farm loan applicants receive equal support and have a consistent customer experience with USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) regardless of their individual circumstances.
- FSA makes loans to youth to establish and operate agricultural income-producing projects in connection with 4-H clubs, FFA and other agricultural groups. The maximum loan amount is \$5,000.



EDUCATION CORNER

Matthew's meet with Eric Eliasson (4H Lexington) about a potential collaboration for summer programs and outreach. Plus, a new Memorandum of Agreement with Forts Pond Elementary was signed for September 2023-May 2024 afterschool programs.

He's met with teachers to conduct Enviroscape programs, pollinator presentations, rainfall simulators and to coordinate seed donations. Forts Pond Elementary got to see the rainfall simulator and learned why living roots are so important in keeping soil in place and limiting water/pollutant runoff.

March looks to be even busier with several more garden beds getting started and lots of seedlings almost ready to go in the ground. Spring is right around the corner!
